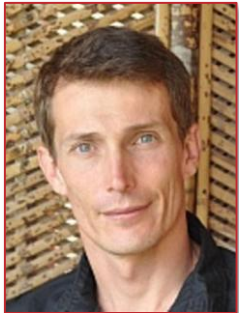

Empowering Climate Action: Exploring Climate Risk and Pathways to Adaptation is a hands-on undergraduate summer school that introduces students to the major climate risks facing Europe, drawing on the European Climate Risk Assessment's findings on heat, drought, flooding, ecosystem change, and impacts on daily life.

Having completed this course, students:

- demonstrate an understanding of climate change and climate risk assessment
- can critically assess and understand information
- can work and communicate across disciplines
- have experienced problem-based learning
- understand how climate risks intersect with food systems, health, infrastructure, and social justice
- will understand the importance, and need of climate change mitigation and adaptation actions
- have developed new networks and collaborations

Governing Climate Risk: Research, Methods, and Action offers a unique opportunity to develop your research and teaching skills while engaging with Europe's climate challenges.

By the end of the programme, participants will be able to:

- Analyse climate-change risks using interdisciplinary frameworks, deepening their understanding of both scientific and socio-political dimensions of risk.
- Evaluate approaches to climate-risk mitigation, adaptation, and risk management, comparing their effectiveness across different geographic and governance contexts.
- Apply core principles of effective university teaching by designing and delivering short learning activities suited to BA-level students.
- Communicate complex research clearly and persuasively through strengthened presentation, facilitation, and science-communication skills.
- Develop and justify a coherent course structure, including learning outcomes and sequencing of content for undergraduate learners.
- Assess trade-offs and strategic options for decision-makers by integrating scientific evidence, uncertainty, and ethical considerations.
- Collaborate effectively across disciplines and countries, working with peers from different academic backgrounds and Circle U. universities to co-produce knowledge and shared outputs.

Circle U's summer school "Democracy and Development in a Fragmenting World" (1–5 June 2026, University of Belgrade) examines how shifting power relations and a weakening liberal international order shape democracy, development, and global inequality. Bringing together students and scholars from across Europe, the programme combines online lectures and a week of in-person teaching, discussions, and group work. Participants will explore themes such as poverty, corruption, climate change, foreign aid, elections, populism, and multilateral governance, and develop critical, evidence-based policy and academic arguments.

CU.mil Summer School 2026

Researching language/s in education from an ecological
and mixed-methods perspective

Course aims

1. Delve into the intricacies of planning, implementing, and analysing **ecologically framed mixed methods studies**
2. Explore broader implications for different research topics and approaches relevant for investigating **language/s in education** (SL/FLL, CLIL, EMI)
3. Strengthen the **collaboration** between researchers



This course will address questions such as

- In what ways can I make my language-in-education study more **ecologically valid**?
- How can I **integrate qualitative and quantitative methods** to achieve empirical convergence or identify divergence?
- How can I properly **draw conclusions** from my mixed-methods dataset?
- To what extent is **teacher-researcher collaboration** helpful for my study?



Course structure

- The Blended Intensive Programme (4 ECTS) consists of two parts:
 1. **June 1-26** (virtual component):
 - Share and learn about each other's research projects
 - First round of exchange related to set readings on mixed methods research within educational linguistics
 2. **June 29 – July 3** (onsite component):
 - Summer school at the University of Vienna (lectures, workshops, and project-work sessions)
 - Programme from Monday morning – Friday afternoon



Workshops

Research approaches, such as:

- Design-Based Research
- Video-Based Classroom Observation
- Qualitative Component Analysis

Research focuses, such as:

- Emotions and fluency in language learning
- Language assessment
- Bi/multilingual disciplinary literacies in CLIL
- The use of technology in language and CLIL teaching



Course participants

- Interested researchers in the field of applied linguistics, especially **PhD students**, but also **PostDocs** and **language teachers** from Circle U universities
- While the primary language is English, practical applications for other foreign languages will be presented
- Researchers working with any foreign language are strongly encouraged to participate

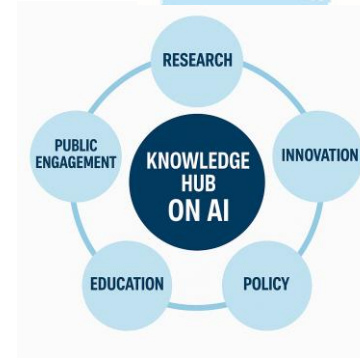

- Balancing innovation with the protection of fundamental rights is essential for developing and using “good AI.”



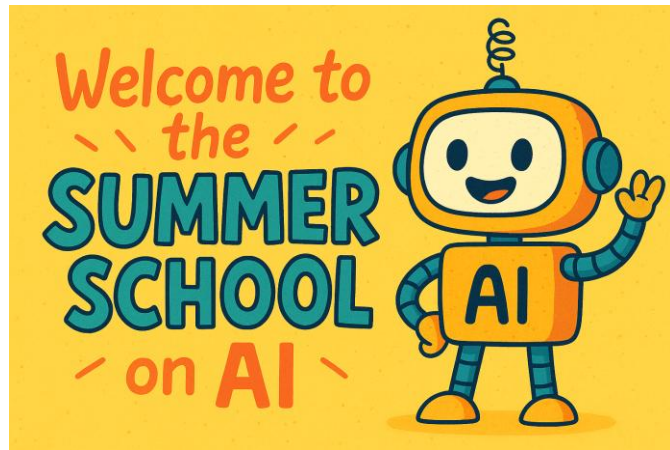

PROJECT

Group Project Requirements – Human-Centered AI (multidisciplinary groups)

- Develop an **application idea** in the field of Human-Centered AI
- The project should demonstrate **potential impact on society or individuals**
- Identify and discuss the **risks** related to Human-Centered AI (e.g., fairness, bias, transparency, accountability, inclusion)
- Provide a balanced view: highlight benefits while critically assessing challenges
- Prepare a final presentation summarizing the concept, impact, and risk evaluation



REQUIREMENTS

Who is the summer school intended for?

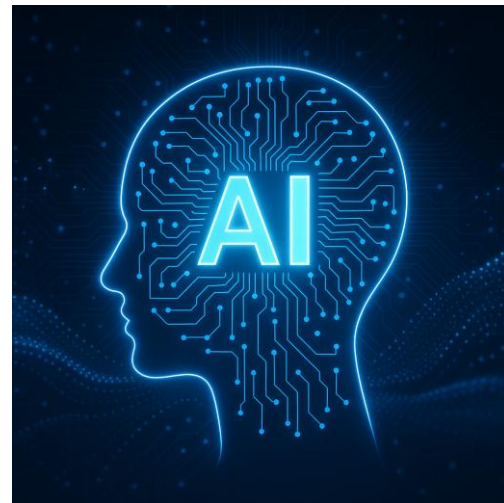
- PhD students (primarily from Circle U. universities) with interest in AI

Who are the teachers?

- Professors from the Circle U. universities

Requirements for obtaining the 3 ECTS credits

- Active attendance at the lectures (with interactive participation whenever possible)
- Contribution to the development of the group project (each member is expected to be engaged and proactive)
- Presentation of the project on the final day
- Positive assessment of the project

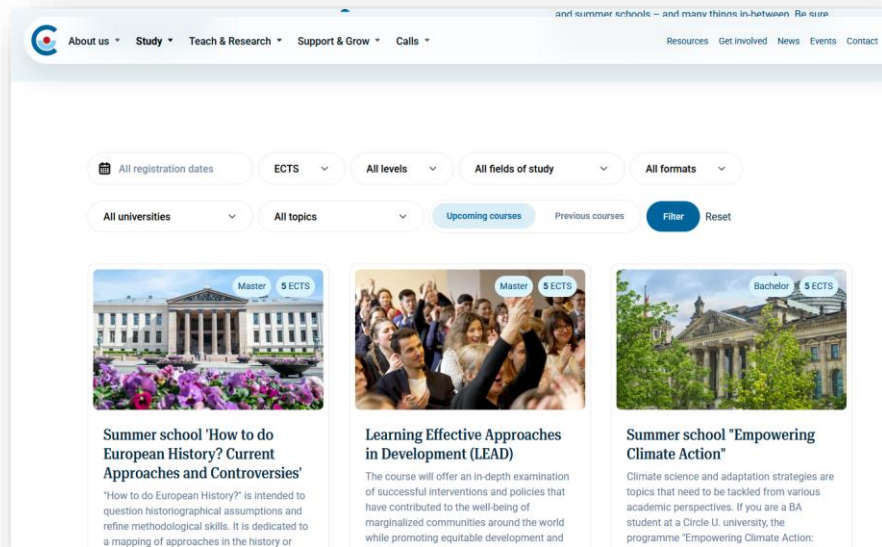
